




We offer our Manhattan Range as the most perfect range for Roasting, Broiling, and Baking.

The above represents the fire ready for broiling or roasting. By opening the back damper and lowering the front blower all the smoke or smell arising is carried away into the chimney.

The old style of Ranges the broiling is done on top or front of fire, or on a special charcoal fire; first, the smell and smoke arising fills the house, second, an extra charcoal fire has to be made when using an extra broiler. In our Manhattan Range we avoid all that by sliding the cast iron partition dividing the oven with fire, the oven is ready for Broiling or Roasting. It can also be used for Baking by pulling forward the partition. This range is made of same material as our French ranges, the water back being very large, it will supply all the hot water needed in a family.





They can be fitted to any size fire-place with a Water back. The Broiler can be set on either side, having a separate charcoal fire and connected by pipe to the flue.












HOT WATER CARVING TABLE WITH OR WITHOUT PLATE-WARMER.

The Plate-Warmer, which can be added, is made of Sheet-iron, and is heated by the same stove, (which heats both at the same time), and can be made with one or two shelves, as per order. The Stand is made of Cast-iron, and can be easily taken apart and put together; it can also be made of wood by purchaser.






THE BRIGHTON COFFEE AND TEA URN.

PATENTED

July 27th, and October 5th and 12th, 1869,

and December 12th, 1882.



This illustration shows our "Brighton" Urn for Coffee and Tea, which is superior to any made.

1st. In this Urn the contents of the inner vessel cannot boil, which is a very important advantage, as Coffee boiled loses its flavor. For Tea, it has the same advantage, holding the flavor over twenty-four hours, while for Milk, it is of greater importance, as boiled Milk thickens, and is useless after.

The inner vessel D, which holds the Coffee or Tea, is made of Copper, heavily tinned and can be taken out for re-tinning by unscrewing the lock-nuts inside and lifting it out without moving the body or steam connections, and can also be heated by gas or lamp, as desired.


The Basket that holds the Coffee or Tea is made of Copper, heavily tinned, and has a perforated bottom, H, under which is a flannel bottom, I, stretched over a wire ring fastened with three hooks, giving another advantage over other Urns, which gives a perfect clear beverage without using eggs or other ingredients. The flannel being detachable, can be washed and replaced without any trouble. It also has the gauge, A, which shows how much coffee the Urn contains.

DIRECTIONS FOR USING:

Fill the body, E, through the funnel, F, half full of water; take off the cover, C, also the inner cover, place the Coffee or Tea in the basket, replace the inner cover and pour on top the amount of boiling water required; replace the cover, C, and the Coffee is ready for use.

Tea is made exactly the same.

Be careful and keep the body, E, filled with water up to the small faucet on the side.


The above figure of our "Brighton" Urns is considered the most perfect arrangement for Hotels; they are made of the same material, and in the same manner as those on the previous page.

The centre Urn is connected with each of the other Urns, and when the water is at the boiling point, it can be transmitted to either of them by simply opening the valves.

This figure represents a Coffee or Tea Urn, made of planished Copper, with a Copper basket inside; it can be heated by gas, steam or lamp.



The water gauge, A, indicates the quantity the Urn contains, without removing the cover. At the top of said gauge is a brass knob, A, which unscrews to allow the cleaning of the glass tube inside; under this knob is a nut which can also be unscrewed when accident neccessitates a new tube; in front of the gauge are two additional knobs, B and C, which are removed when the pipes connecting with the Urn need cleaning. A thermometer, B, indicating the degree of heat required to keep contents warm.




The illustration shows an improved apparatus for rapidly distilling Coffee and Tea. This admirable and simple invention, which saves one-third the Coffee and Tea, which are wasted in Urns and Pots where the grounds are not separated from the infusion, is easily operated, and requires only eight minutes to produce a perfectly clear and highly flavored beverage, using no eggs or other ingredients to clear it with—the liquid being strong, and in appearance like wine.

Its action is automatic, and may be regulated by a simple device—which is one of the novel features of the invention. The interior construction of a large sized Urn, adapted to the use of hotels, restaurants, steamships, &c., is exhibited in the sectional view.

The beverage is made by filtration through the ground berry. This apparatus has two principal portions—a Water and Coffee receptacle below, and a detachable dripper or compartment above in which the ground Coffee is placed. The lower division is double: a receiver, A, for the made infusion being inserted in the water vessel, B. Communicating with the latter, and extending up through the receiver and into the upper compartment, is a tube, C, having a detachable perforated cap. Surrounding the upper portion of the tube is a conical piece which is attached to the bottom of the dripper or basket. Another funnel shaped portion, attached to the cover surmounts the perforated cap. The bottom of the upper compartment, on which the Coffee is placed, is perforated, and below this is a ring on which a piece of flannel is stretched, which effectually filters the Coffee or Tea, said ring being detachably held in place by hooks.

The Receiver, A, can be taken out for tinning by unscrewing the locknuts and a screw flange on cornish of body B.

When the water in the vessel, B, is boiled, the steam generated forces it up into the tube, C, and through the openings in the perforated cap, when it is deflected downward by the funnel shaped piece attached to the lid, and filters through the Coffee and sieves, and the liquid Coffee is collected in the receiver, A, whence it is drawn off by one or more faucets connecting therewith. The water chamber is filled either by a supply pipe attached to the bottom of the Urn, or through the funnel top opening which is closed by a cap with a spring safety valve, D, said valve being either opened or closed by taking hold of the ring on its stem and turning it one-fourth round.

A steam coil is used for heating the water where convenient; otherwise heat may be applied directly to the Urn by stove, range or gas.

The object of making the upper end of the tube, C, detachable, is to allow of cleaning in case it should become clogged, and the flannel and ring filter may be removed for a like purpose.
