
No. 16. IRON STUMP BEDSTEAD, on castors, painted dark green.


No 18. IRON FRENCH BEDSTEAD, japanned cane colour, with brass vases.








No. 28. Superior Four-Post Bedstead, of taper iron tubing, japanned maple, with brass wases and castors.




DESCRIPTION OF KITCHEN APPARATUS No. 1.

A .- THE OXFORD ROASTING RANGE, the first specimen of which, in London, was introduced by BENHAM AND Sons at the celebrated Kitchen of the Reform Club, and which, with the whole of the Cooking Apparatus, was fitted up by them under the superintendence of the late M. Sover.

The Improved Self-acting Water Ram, is peculiarly adapted for raising water out of valleys or low grounds, or from the banks of a river or running stream, to the top of the adjoining hills or high grounds, for supplying mansions, houses, and farm yards, ponds, reservoirs, &c. It works day and night, without any attendance or expense, after it is once fixed. It is necessary to have a fall of water to work it, and the greater the height of the fall, the more effective will be the machine. The greater the height of the lift, of course the less will be the quantity raised in a given time.

HOT WATER APPARATUS,

For warming Churches, Chapels, and Public Buildings; Halls, Staircases, and Private Houses; Conservatories, Greenhouses, Forcing Pits, &c.






The use of Hot Water Apparatus, for diffusing artificial heat, has now become general, and its merits are universally acknowledged.

It is perfectly safe, free from any unpleasant smell, and may be efficiently managed by any person of ordinary intelligence.

The hot water circulates through iron pipes. The whole of the water in the apparatus passes successively through the boiler, and communicates the heat which it thus receives from the fuel, to the various buildings and apartments where the warmth is required. There are no buildings, however large, to which it cannot be advantageously adapted.

The arrangements vary greatly, according to the nature and construction of the building. For halls and staircases, pedestal-coils are frequently used, as represented above, which may be enclosed by an ornamental trellis enclosure, surmounted by a marble slab, as shown by the following engraving.


The pipes may also be placed out of sight, and the warm air introduced through the floors or skirtings of the apartments.

Fitted up in panelled wood enclosure with hot and cold services and waste.



The hot and cold water are admitted by means of the lever handles at the end, and the Bath is afterwards emptied in a similar manner. The hot water may be supplied either from the boiler of the Kitchen Range, or from a fire in the Bath Room, or from a distinct furnace.

A SHOWER BATH can also be fitted up over it, as represented above, with the hot and cold water laid on.

HOT WATER SUPPLY TO NURSERIES, BEDROOMS, &c.

A CONSTANT SUPPLY OF HOT WATER may be provided for NURSERIES, BED ROOMS, DRESSING ROOMS, BATH ROOMS, or any parts of the house, by means of pipes from the boiler of the kitchen range, and without in any way interfering with the kitchen arrangements.

The advantages of this plan, and the saving of time and labour which it effects, are too evident to require any further explanation.
